Continuous Broderie Anglaise Lace Edgings



Method

Hoop 2 layers of water soluble stabilizer. Stitch the first 3 colors. This will be the lace edging bits and the die line for the fabric placement.



Take the hoop out of the machine. Place a piece of fabric over the die line and stitch the next color.



Materials

Water soluble stabilizer

Cotton Fabric

Ribbon

**Wingneedle
(Optional)**

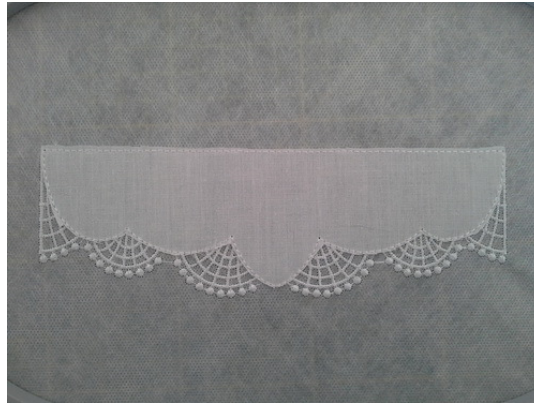




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Take the hoop out of the machine. Trim the fabric away from around the stitching.



Stitch the next color. At this point you can change your needle to a wingneedle and stitch the rest of the design. The wingneedle will make the holes for a true Broderie Anglaise look.. Or you can use a regular needle and finish the design. Using a regular needle won't create the holes that a wingneedle will but you will still have a pretty edging.



Stitch out as many as you need to create the length. Using your sewing machine, zig-zag the sides together before rinsing out the stabilizer. When done, rinse out the stabilizer and allow to dry. Thread ribbon through the holes (if your design allows) and use to trim hand towels, tea towels, pillow cases or clothing.
