Drawstring Felt Treasure Bags

For the Lady Bug

Stitch 1 front

Stitch 1 Back

For the Cow

Stitch 1 Ears

Stitch 1 Front

For the Puppy

Stitch 1 Ears

Stitch 1 Front

Stitch 1 back

For the Frog

Stitch 1 front

Stitch 1 Back

Stitch 1 Legs

Materials

Felt in assorted colors

Clear Utility Bags (20 micron)

Embroidery Thread

**PVC craft cord
(scoubidoo cord)**

Plastic Beads

Eyelet Tool





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Method

Hoop two layers of the utility bag. Be sure it is a 20 micron bag. It should say the micron on the packaging.

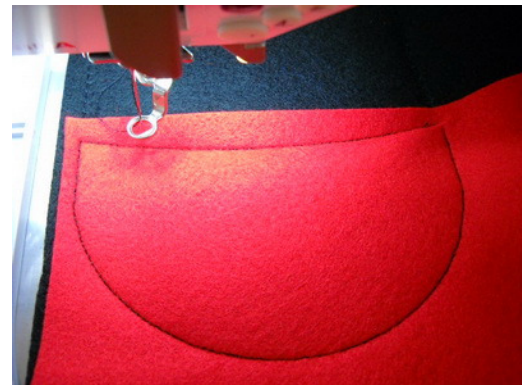
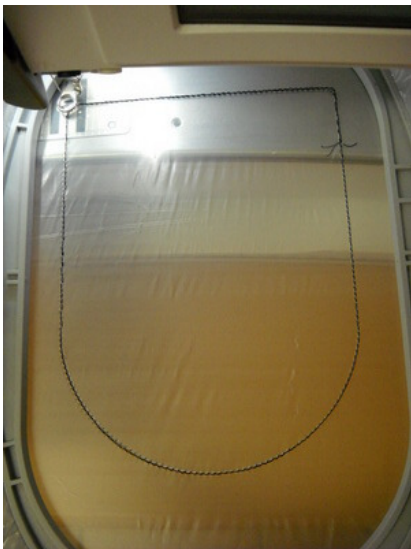
Stitch the first color. This marks where to put the first layer of felt.

Place a piece of felt onto the stitched area and stitch the next color. This holds the felt down. Stitch the next color. This marks where to put a second piece of felt. Stitch the next color and trim excess felt. At this point no more felt will be added to the design if you are stitching the ladybug or puppy bags. Another layer of felt is required for the frog and cow bags, so stitch the next color, place the piece of felt and stitch the next color. Trim away felt.

Now stitch the rest of the design.

When the design is complete, cut remainder of felt and cut away from the plastic. The plastic literally lines the inside of the bag.

Bag Back

Hoop two layers of the utility bag. Be sure it is a 20 micron bag. It should say the micron on the packaging. Stitch the first color. This marks where to put the first layer of felt. Place a piece of felt onto the stitched area and stitch the next color. This holds the felt down. Stitch the rest of the design. When the design is complete, cut remainder of felt and cut away from the plastic

Ears and Legs are stitched the same as for the Bag Back

Assembling the bags

Using the eyelet tool. Punch out the holes on the sides of bag front, back and ears and leg pieces. Cut open the buttonholes.



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Using a length of craft cord, tie a bead to the one end.



Using the craft cord, thread the front and back bag pieces together, going up and down through the holes. The ears and leg pieces have holes too, so place them between the front and back pieces to thread them in. When you get to the end of the bag, tie it off using another bead. Thread cord through the button holes and tie beads to the ends.
