FSL Continuous Machine Drawn Threadwork



Method

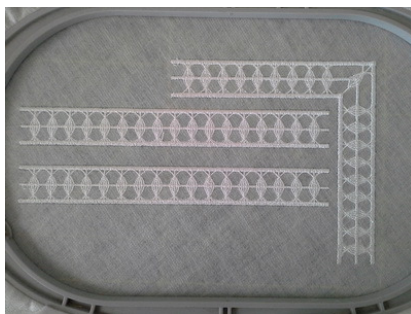
*Note. The first color of each design is a marker or placement line for those who wish to embroider the pieces together using placement to create a continuous piece.

I stitch out all my pieces individually and then zig-zagged them together. I found it easier. I skipped the first color as I wasn't doing placement.

Open ended pieces have an overlapping space to create the continuity of the design.

Use this method to stitch out the required number of pieces

Hoop 2 layers of water soluble stabilizer. Stitch out the design.



Materials

Water soluble stabilizer

Embroidery Thread

Fabric for cloth or ready made cloth



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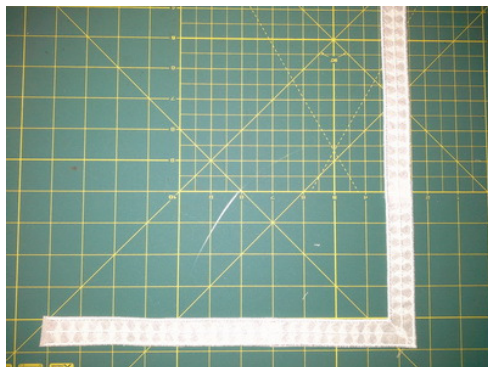
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Cut the pieces out of the stabilizer. Stitch the joining pieces together along the satin edges using your sewing machine and a zig-zag stitch. The open ended pieces have an overlapping area. Overlap these ends when stitch the pieces together.



Now stitch the Drawn Thread Lace onto the fabric / ready made cloth again using a zip-zag stitch. You need to stitch it along the top and bottom of the design. Do not stitch in the middle of the design even if there is a bar there. That is part of the lace design. Cut away the fabric from behind the lace being careful not to cut the Drawn Threadwork Lace. Remove the stabilizer
