## Pansy Fabric and Lace Edgings



### Materials

**Water soluble stabilizer**

**Cotton Fabric**

**Sharp pointed scissors**

**Embroidery thread**

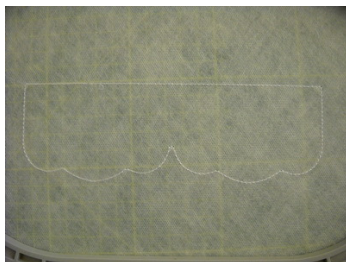
**Ribbon**

### Method

\*The first two colors are in different shades as they are color stops. I used white for both of these.

Hoop 2 layers of water soluble stabilizer. Stitch the first color. This marks where to place your fabric. Place a piece of cotton fabric over the stitched area.

Stitch the next color. This holds the fabric in place.

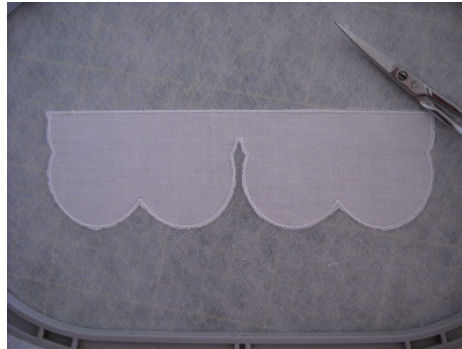


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Trim the fabric from around the tack down stitch.



Stitch out the rest of the design. Color stops have been put in for the lace section. Once the pansies and leaves have been stitched, I used white for the lace and a soft shade for the accent trims.



Cut the design out of the stabilizer. Stitch as many as you require. I needed 2 to edge a small hand towel



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Using your sewing machine and a zig-zag stitch, stitch the pieces together.



Rinse out the stabilizer and allow to dry. Thread ribbon through the holes in designs that have them. Stitch to the edge of towels, hand towels, cloths, tea towels and even clothing
