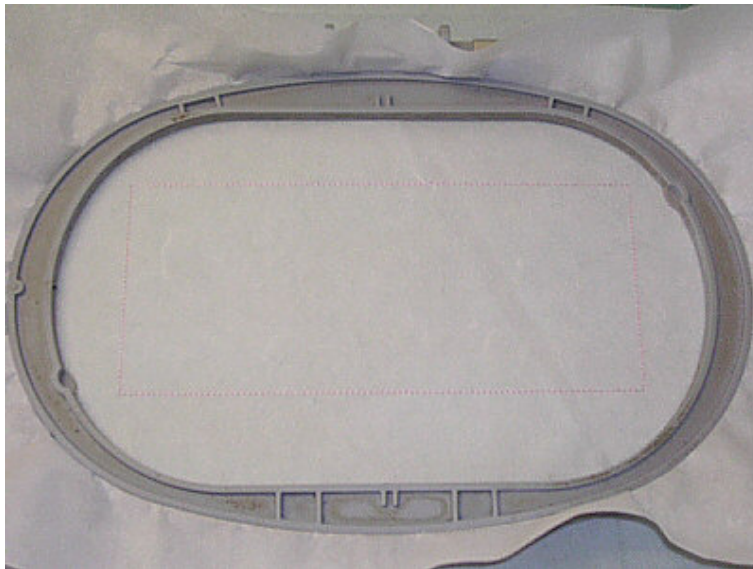


# Threads n Scissors

## Method

**Use this method to stitch out the side and end panels**

Hoop 2 layers of stabilizer. Stitch out the first colour.



## Materials

Tear away stabilizer

Plain Cotton Fabric

Printed Cotton Fabric

Batting (optional)

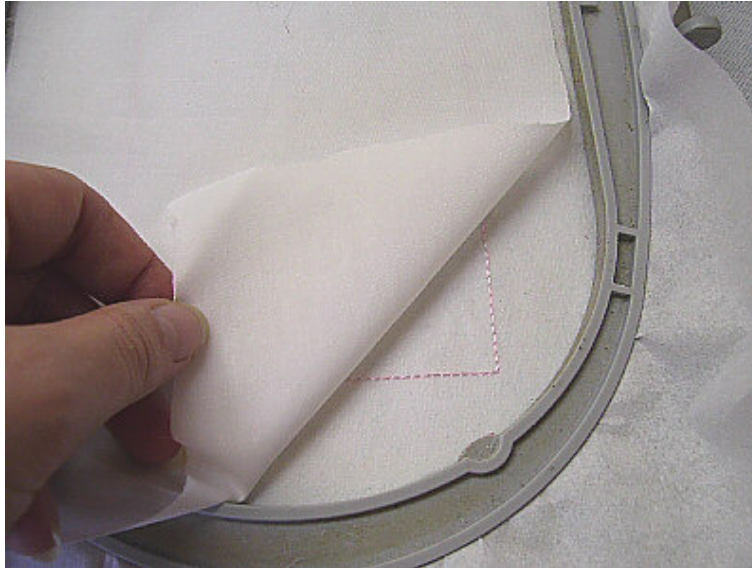
Ribbon for ties

505 Temporary Adhesive spray

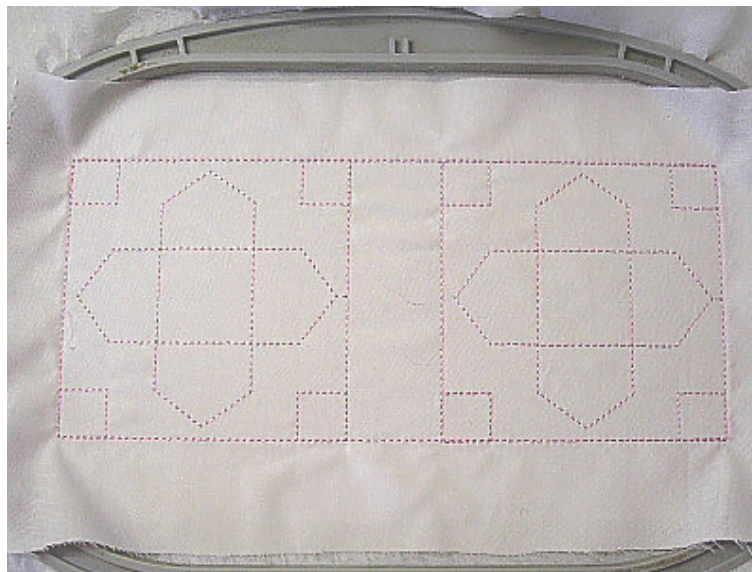
Embroidery Thread (I used Marathon Thread)

Cut 2 pieces of plain cotton fabric larger than the stitched area. If batting is to be used cut a piece of batting as well. Lightly spray the plain cotton fabric and place one piece on the underside of the hoop covering the stitched area and the other piece of fabric on the upper side of the hoop. If batting is to be used, place the piece of batting before the fabric on the upper side of the hoop.

# Threads n Scissors



Stitch out the next colour.



Cut a piece of printed cotton fabric and lightly spray the wrong side of the fabric with 505 and press it into place on top of the stitched area.

# Threads n Scissors



Stitch out the next colour. Remove hoop from machine and using sharp scissors, cut away excess fabric from both upper and undersides of the hoop as shown in the photos below. Each tissue box side and end panels can be seen

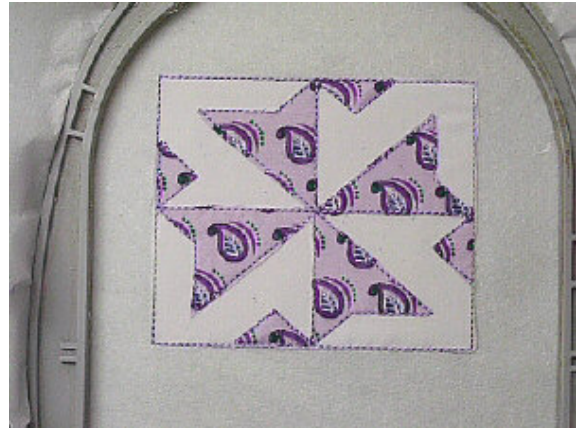

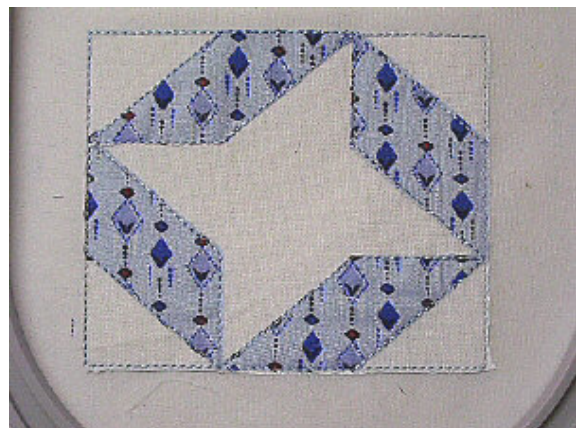

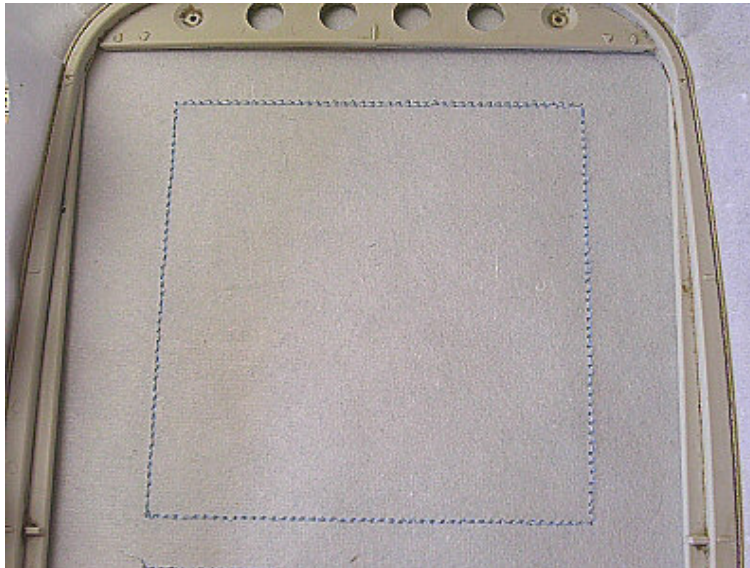


# Threads n Scissors

Stitch out the last colour.

## Method for the top and base pieces of the tissue box

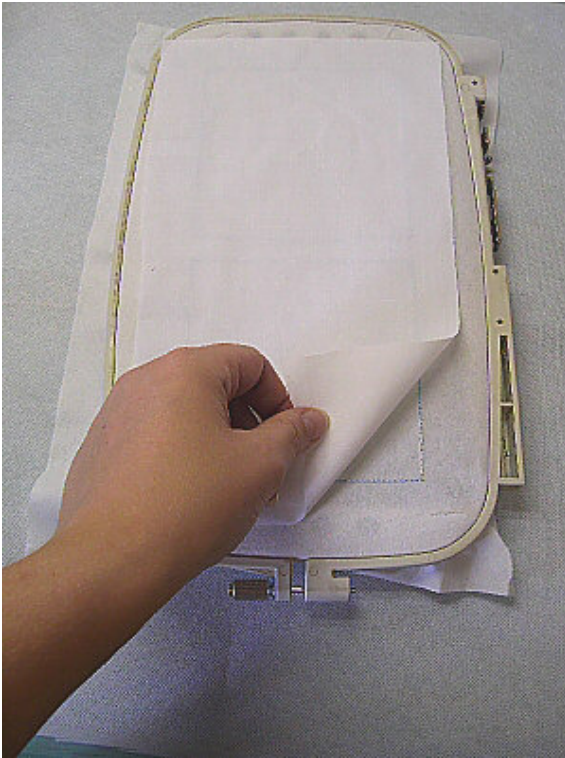
Hoop 2 layers of stabilizer. Stitch out the first colour.



Cut 2 pieces of cotton fabric - one plain and one printed - larger than the stitched area. If batting is to be used cut a piece of batting as well. Lightly spray the plain cotton fabric and place one piece on the underside of the hoop covering the stitched area and the other piece of fabric on the upper side of the hoop. If batting is to be used, place the piece of batting before the fabric on the upper side of the hoop.

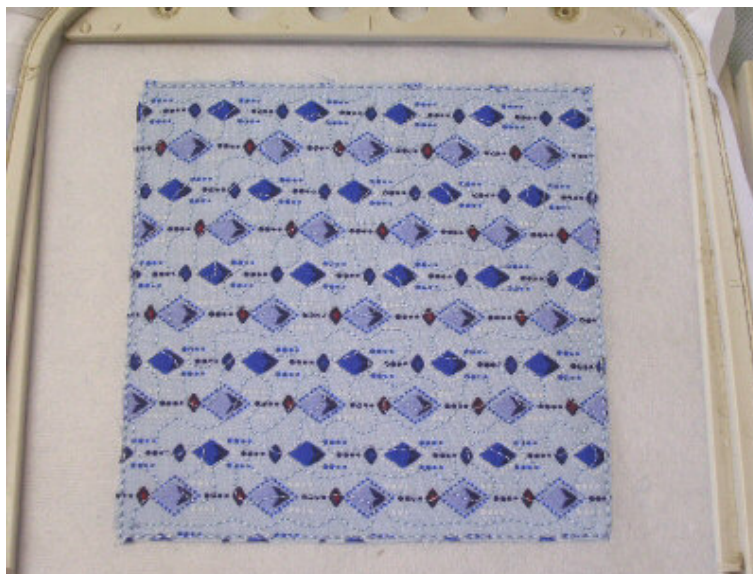
Underside of hoop

Stitch out the next colour. Remove hoop from machine and using sharp scissors, cut away excess fabric from both upper and undersides of the hoop as shown in the photos below.

## **To Assemble the Tissue Box**

Using a wide zig-zag stitch on your sewing machine, stitch a Top Panel piece to a side panel piece. Do the same with the other top panel and side panel piece. Stitch the base panel pieces together along the wider side. Now stitch the side panels and the end panels to the base pieces. Stitch the side panels to the end pieces. You should now have a box. Do not stitch the top panels to the end panels. Now stitch the ribbon into place for the ties. Tissue box is complete.
