

Swiss Trims

Method

- 1. Hoop 2 layers of water soluble stabilizer. Stitch the first color. These are placement lines
 - 2. Stitch the second color. This will be the lace.
 - 3. Stitch the next color.
 - 4. Place fabric onto the stitch lines cut the length you require.
- 5. Stitch the next color and trim excess fabric away leaving a "tail" to stitch on the next design.
 - 6. Stitch the rest of the design.
- 7. Cut out of the stabilizer. This piece will be used when stitching more designs onto it to create continuous trims.

Materials

- Water Soluble Stabilizer
- Thin Poly Cotton or Batiste
- **Embroidery Thread**
- Thin ribbon or yarn











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Now for the next design on your continuous trim.

- 1. Hoop 2 layers of water soluble stabilizer. Stitch the first color. These are placement lines
 - 2. Stitch the second color. This will be the lace.
 - 3. Stitch the next color.
- 4. Place the already stitched fabric onto the stitch lines matching the ends. The pieces need to overlap to create the continuous look.. The edge of the newly stitched lace must match up to the edge of the already stitched lace. Use tape to hold the piece in place.





- 5. Stitch the next color and trim excess fabric away leaving a "tail" to stitch on the next design.
 - 6. Stitch the rest of the design.
- 7. Cut out of the stabilizer. This piece will be used when stitching more designs onto it to create continuous

Continue in this way to create the required length of trim!!! Rinse out stabilizer and thread ribbon or yarn through lace. Stitch any loose lace pieces together by hand.





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
