

# Threads n Scissors

## Towel Topper

### Method

Hoop 1 layer of cutaway stabilizer. Stitch the first colour



Cut a piece of batting and plain cotton fabric larger than the area stitched onto the stabilizer. Spray both pieces with temporary adhesive spray and press into place with your hand, covering the stitched area. Stitch the rest of the design until the last two colour changes.



### Materials

Cutaway stabilizer

Thin batting

Printed cotton fabric for the back

Plain cotton fabric for the front

Ribbon 10 inches long

Embroidery Thread

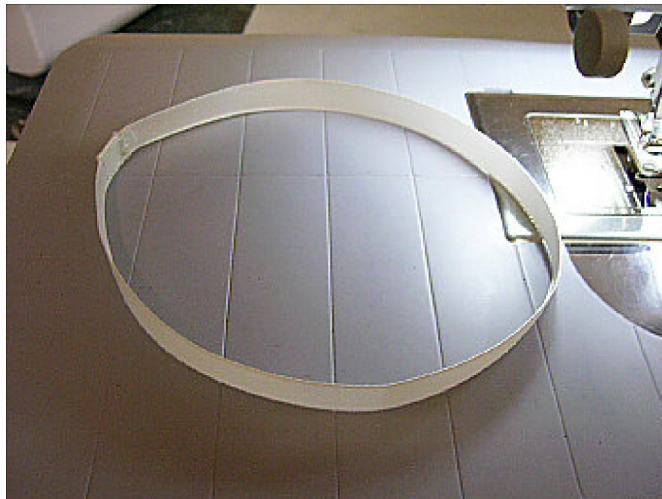
Temporary adhesive spray

## Threads n Scissors

Remove the hoop from the machine. Cut a piece of printed fabric larger than the design. Spray it with temporary adhesive spray and place it on the underside of the hoop covering the stitched area. Stitch the next colour. Remove the hoop from the machine and trim away excess fabric from around the design on both sides of the hoop. Stitch the last colour.

To Assemble the Towel Topper.

Stitch the two open ends of the ribbon together



Lay the ribbon flat placing the two sides next to each other. Turn the towel topper so the wrong side faces. Place the ribbon onto the towel topper making sure that there is a smaller loop for hanging it up and a larger loop below (this is where the dishtowel is going to go) Using a zig-zag stitch, stitch the ribbon into place.



Your towel topper is complete
