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ITH Quilt Label Patches



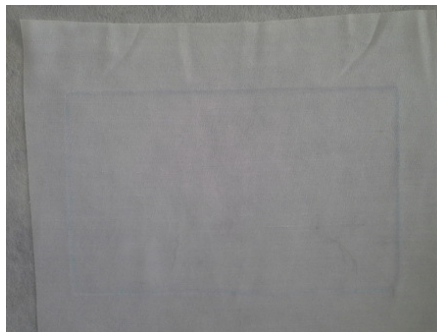
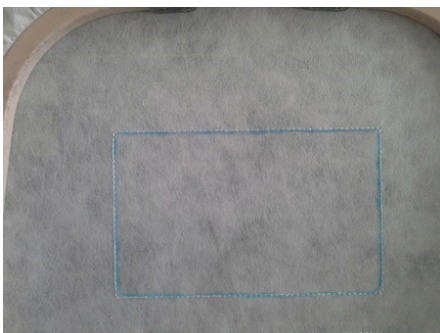
Materials

Cutaway stabilizer
Temporary Adhesive Spray
Plain Cotton Fabric

Color stops have been put in. I used 1 color for the first and last two color stops

Method

Hoop 1 layer of cutaway stabilizer. Stitch the first color. Spray the stabilizer with temporary adhesive spray and place a piece of cotton fabric over the stitched area.



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Stitch the next 3 colors. Remove the hoop from the machine. Turn the hoop over so the backside faces up.

Spray the stabilizer with temporary adhesive spray. Place a piece of cotton fabric over the stitched area. Stitch the next color. Remove the hoop from the machine and trim away the excess fabric from around the design. Stitch the last color. Now cut the design out of the stabilizer. Your quilt label patch is done. Put in a name with a permanent fabric marker. If you want to embroider a name in, then use your embroidery editing software to insert the name before loading the design to your machine. If you don't have embroidery editing software, but your embroidery machine has the option in insert letters already on the machine you can also do that. Be sure to do all the embroidery before putting the backing on and the final two colors of the design.
